I visited the cabin on October 22 and 23 with Sharon and David Stephenson. All was in order. I was especially pleased to see the new green roof and the plywood over the entrance.



NEW YEAR's in the mountains! What better way to start 1978. Space is being reserved at Elkhorn Hot Springs for another club get-together. The area west of Dillon, at Polaris, Montana, offers ski-touring, snowshoeing, downhill skiing at Maverick Mountain, and swimming in a hot pool.

(We are already requesting a basic number of beds.) The accommodations are best described as semi-rustic; the varying-sized cabins, at various prices, have wood heaters (split your own), gas or electric cook stoves, refrigerators, beds, bunks, or cots. Sorry, no running water or indoor toilets this time of year (and it does get cold at 7700' elevation!).

There are also rooms in the two-story log lodge. For those not desiring to cook for themselves meals can be obtained at the lodge. Prices are the same as last year and tend to be very reasonable.

AUTUMN-WINTER ACTIVITIES SCHEDULE, 1977

Trip Classification: Easy-generally under 8 miles round trip and suitable for family participation. Moderate-approximately 8-16 miles; may include steep terrain or some off-trail travel; some overnight backpacking; recent experience desirable. Difficult-(toughies!)long, steep, or indefinite mileage; rough trail or bushwacking; prepare for unpredictable conditions; experience outdoorsperson in good physical condition.

It is advisable to contact leader in advance to determine trip conditions, meeting place, and degree of difficulty of trip. The leader has the option of limiting the number of participants on the trip.
