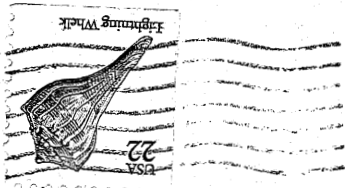

WHOLE WHEAT PUMPKIN BREAD

2/3 c. hot water	1/3 c. wheat germ
2/3 c. raisins	1 tsp. cinnamon
2/3 c. shortening	1/2 tsp. cloves
2 c. brown sugar	1/2 tsp. allspice
2/3 c. molasses	1 tsp. baking soda
4 eggs, slightly beaten	1/2 tsp. baking powder
2 c. canned pumpkin	2 tps. salt
2 c. all-purpose flour	1 c. nuts, chopped
1 c. whole wheat flour	

Add hot water to raisins and set aside to cool. Cream shortening, sugar and molasses until light and fluffy. Blend in eggs and pumpkin. Combine remaining ingredients. Blend into creamed mixture. Mix in raisins and water. Pour into 2 greased 9x5x3" loaf pans. Bake in 350 degree over 1-1 1/2 hours or until done. Cool 10 minutes; turn out of pan and cool before slicing.
