TRIP CALENDAR

December-January, Float Permit Applications. TRIP REPORTS

Hoodoo Pass, November 24. Carol Anderson, Peter Dayton, Art Gidel, Mary ______, Martha Yale, Rick Murney, and Jenny Murney hit Hoodoo Pass, which is located on the Montana-Idaho border south of Superior, Montana, on a super early-season day. The tension was palpable as we headed up Trout Creek through scanty snow conditions, dodging suicidal deer as we drove, and stayed intense until we were within a couple miles of the pass, at which point the snow depth suddenly increased to a more than satisfactory level. The rock coverage was excellent, and the powder was fluffy and well over our ankles.
